It is cutting off payments to the country for the oil it exports to the 16 17 U.S. Russia is trying to make up the difference. The U.S. placed a sanction on the Russian bank that is helping Maduro. 18

19 Maduro cut diplomatic ties with the United States in January. The U.S. said it would keep its diplomats in the country to help the opposition to Maduro. Now The United States is withdrawing all diplomatic personnel 20 21 from its embassy in Venezuela. It says it is doing so because of conditions in the country. The move is a setback for the Trump administration. 22

The U.S. does not appear to have the next steps planned. One idea is that Maduro might detain Guaidó. 26 His arrest could set off demonstrations that overturn the government. Another idea is that the military will 27 28 desert Maduro.

American officials say the struggle in Venezuela is about global communist influence. They 29 have accused Cuba and Russia of propping up Mr. Maduro. U.S. Secretary of State Pompeo spoke. He 30 blamed Cuba and Russia for the Venezuelan blackouts and other social and economic problems. 31

In an acid manner, Pompeo said, "When there is no electricity, thank the marvels of modern Cuban-led 32 engineering. When there's no water, thank the excellent hydrologists from Cuba. When there's no food, thank 33 34 the Cuban communist overlords."

All of this does not change the miseries of the Venezuelan people. If misery can make for a political 35 36 change, Maduro may soon be gone.

Are countries trying to end US dollar's power?

1 Russia's Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov has suggested that the U.S. dollar could be losing its status as 2 the world's most important currency. Mr. Lavrov said that because the U.S. has imposed economic sanctions 3 on countries like Iran, Turkey and Russia, these countries could start conducting international business in their 4 own national currencies instead of the dollar. In addition, countries that have had trade tariffs imposed on them 5 by the U.S. could also do trade in their own currencies.
